There being no further business to bring to the membership, the official meeting was adjourned at 1923.

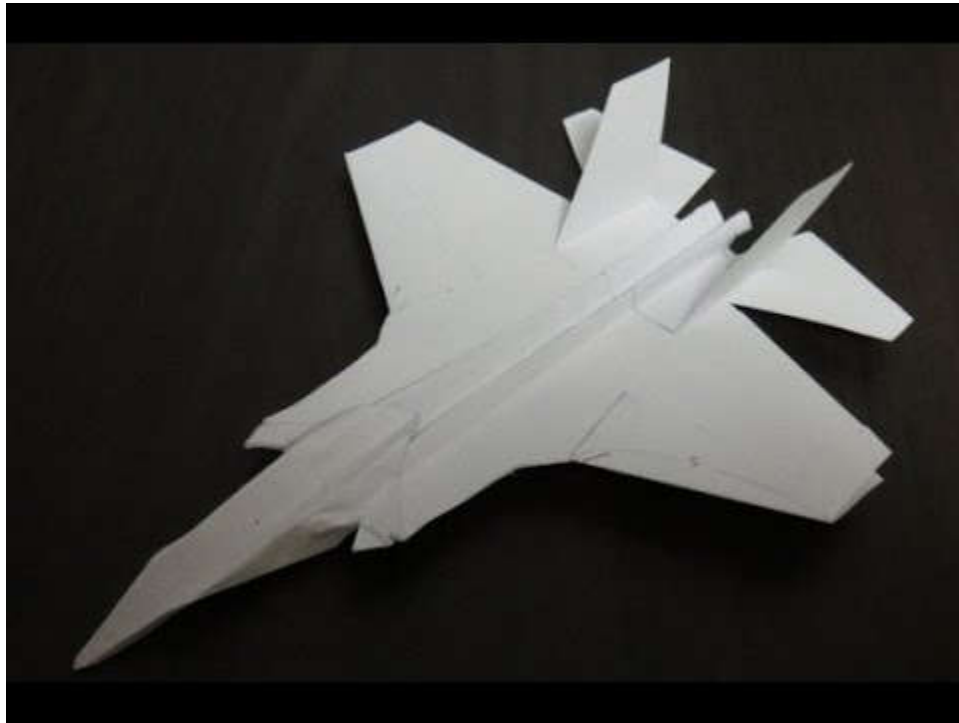
Post-meeting presentation
